

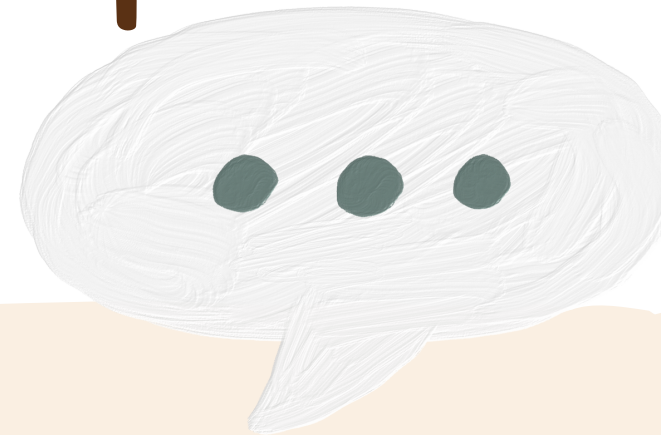

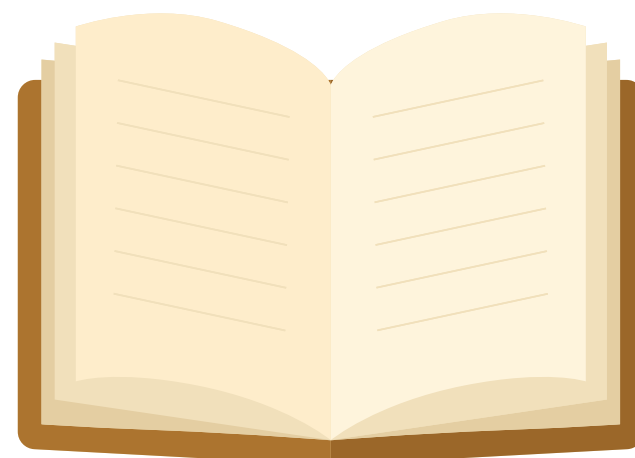




# Invite God to speak to you



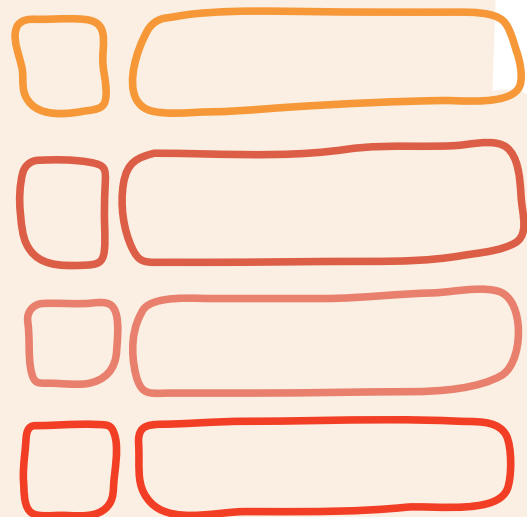
Start with a prayer, asking God to speak to you as you read. Keep a journal handy to jot down any insights or messages that stand out, and refer back to it for future reference.

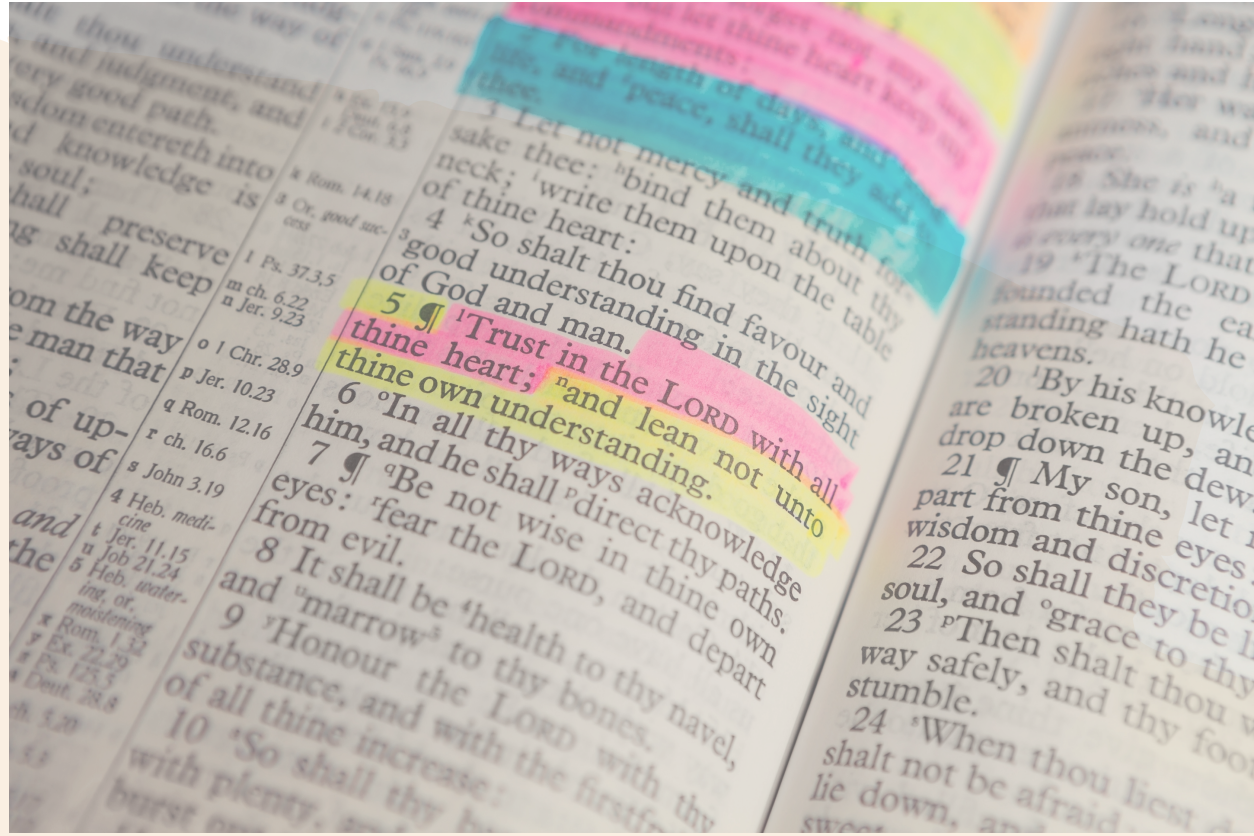


# Take your time

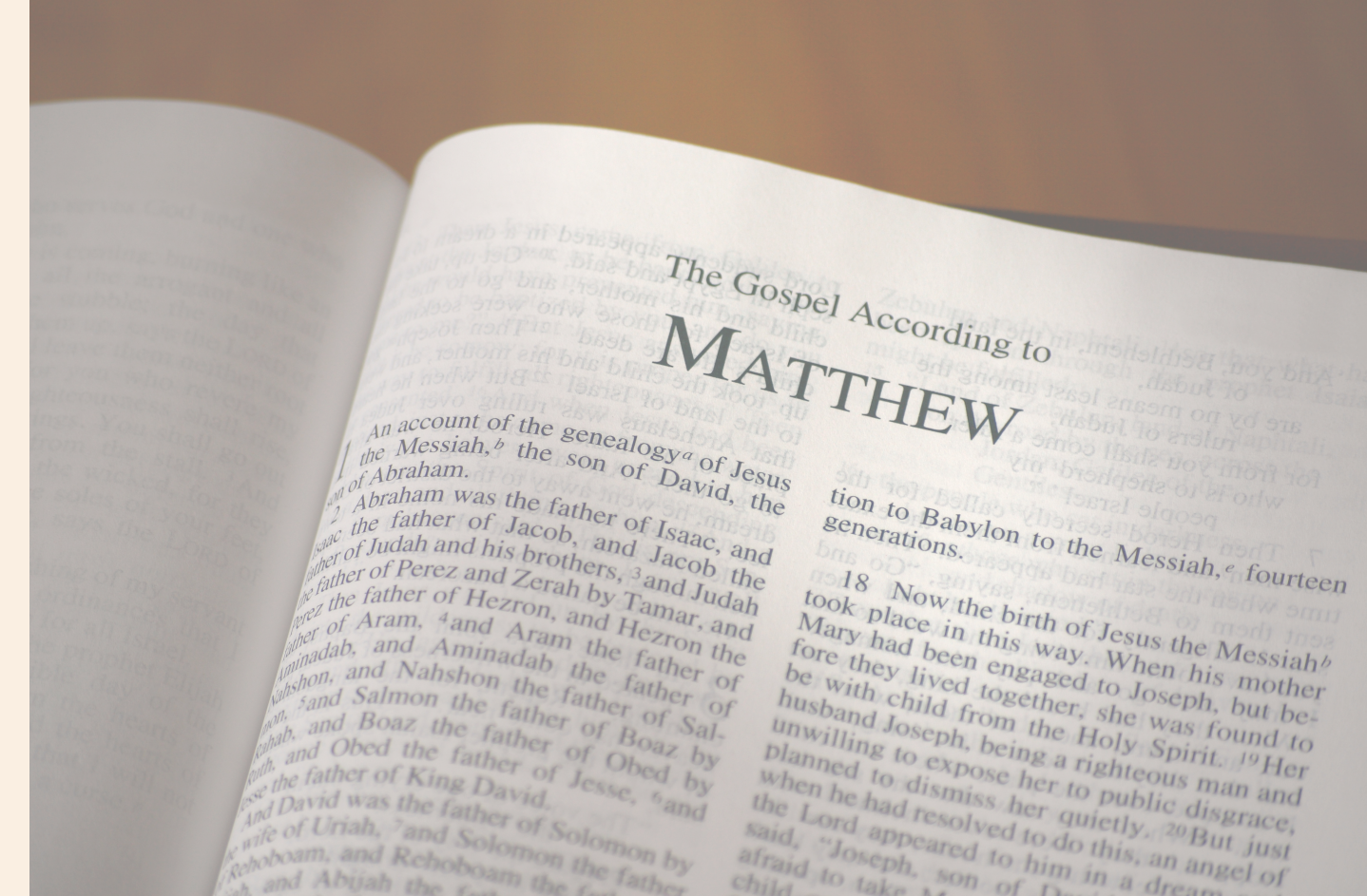
# Specific verses

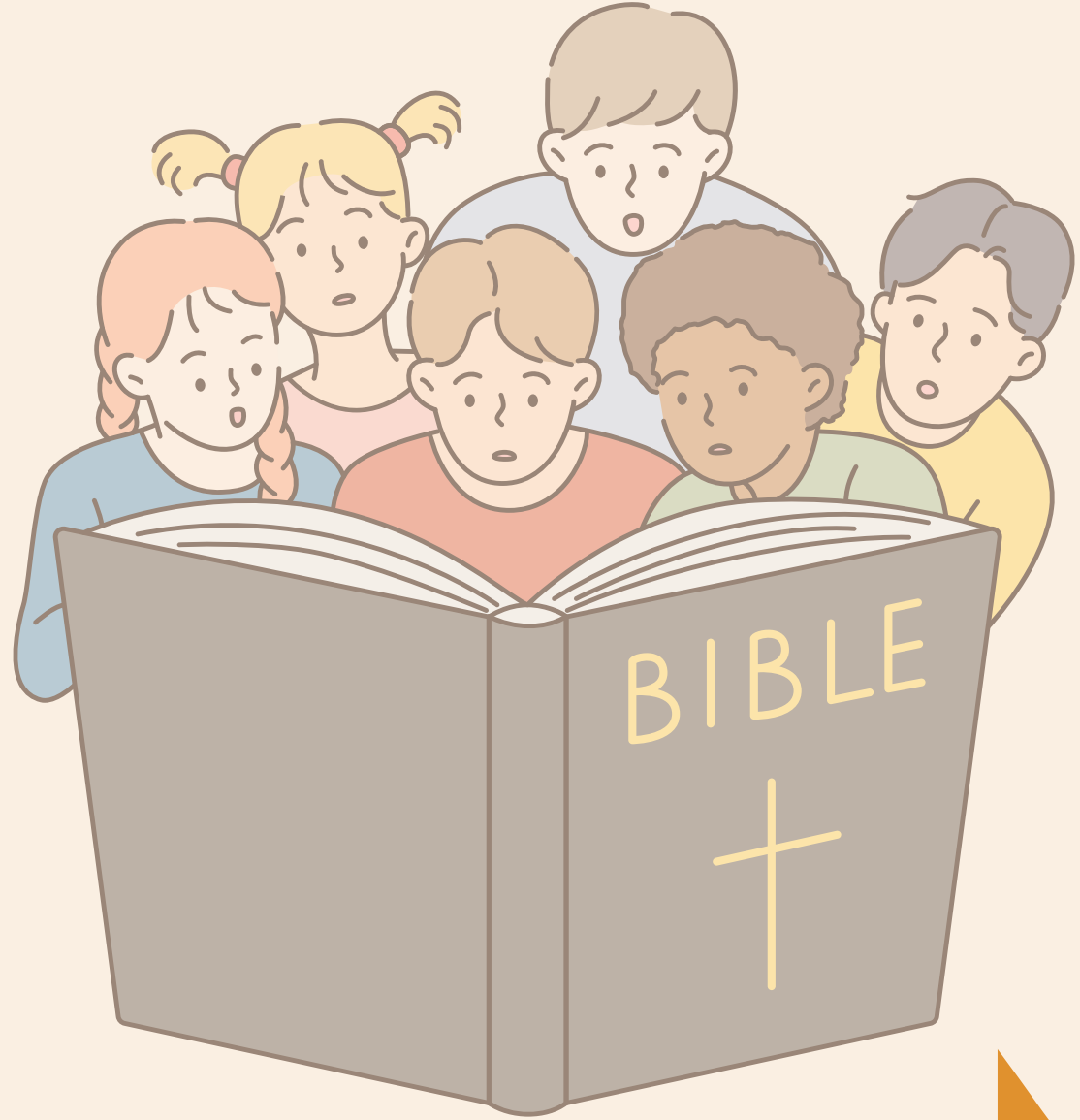

Participating in group Bible studies provides an exceptional opportunity to delve deeper into specific books or subjects. Such a rewarding experience is bound to enhance your spiritual growth

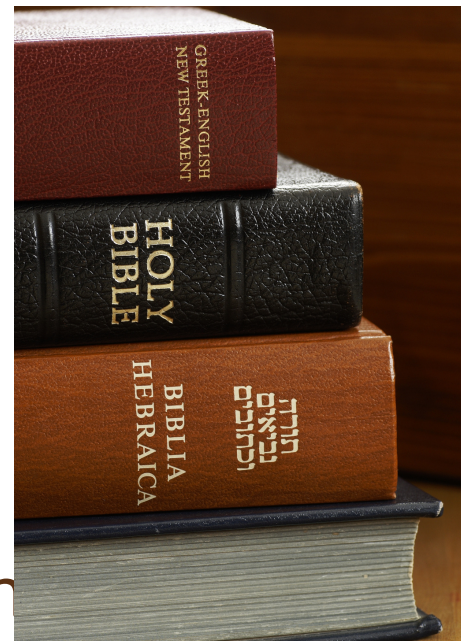

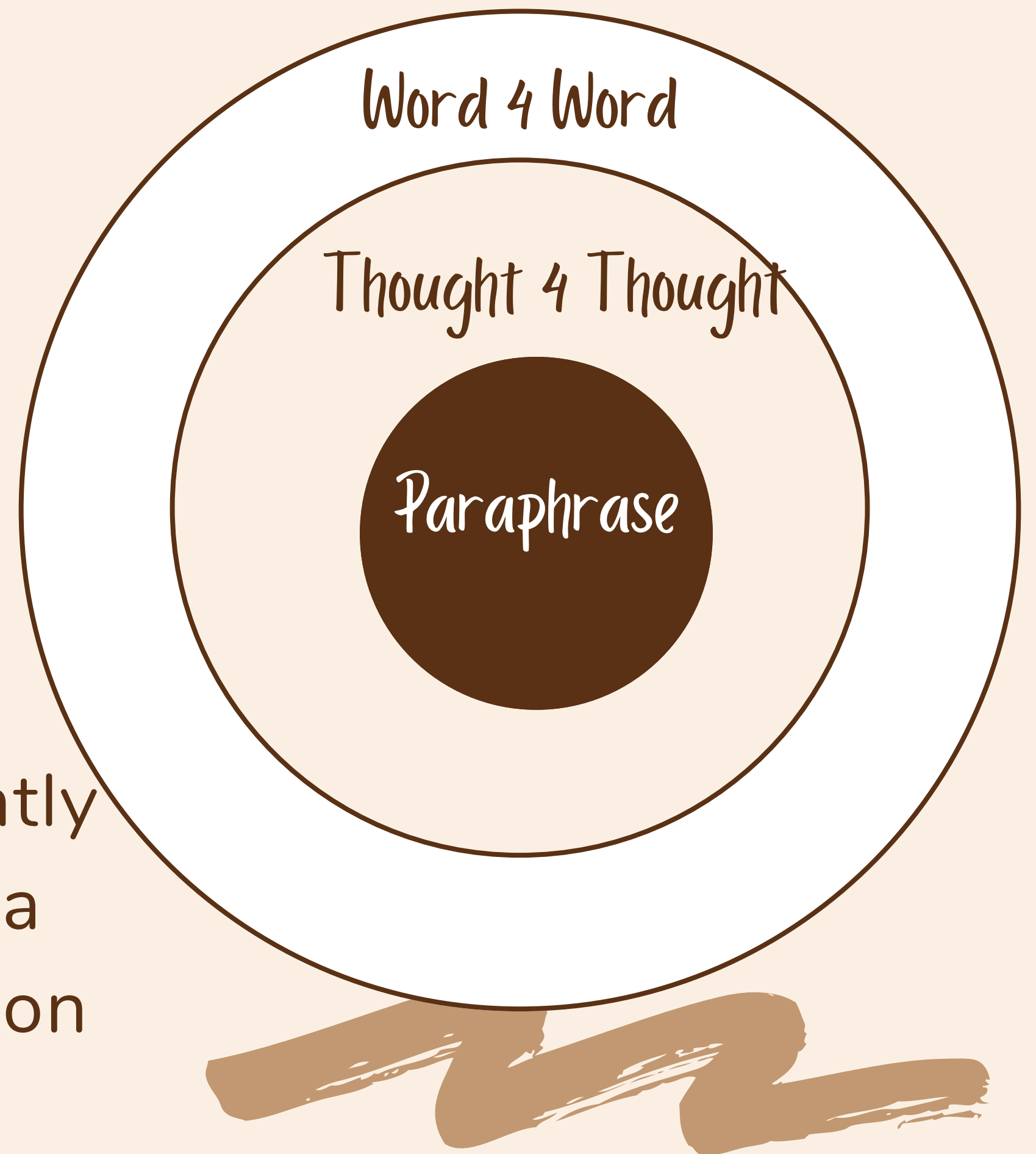
## LEXICONS

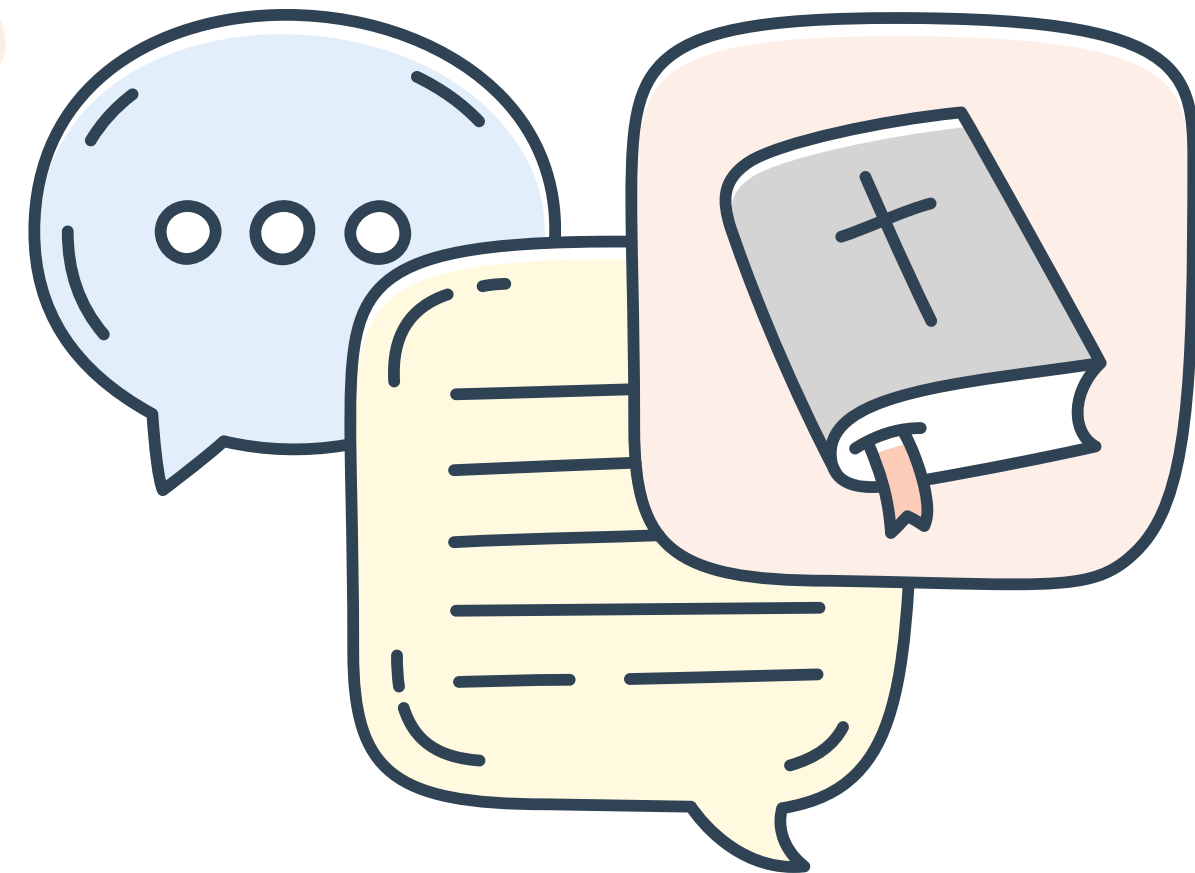
# Different translations
