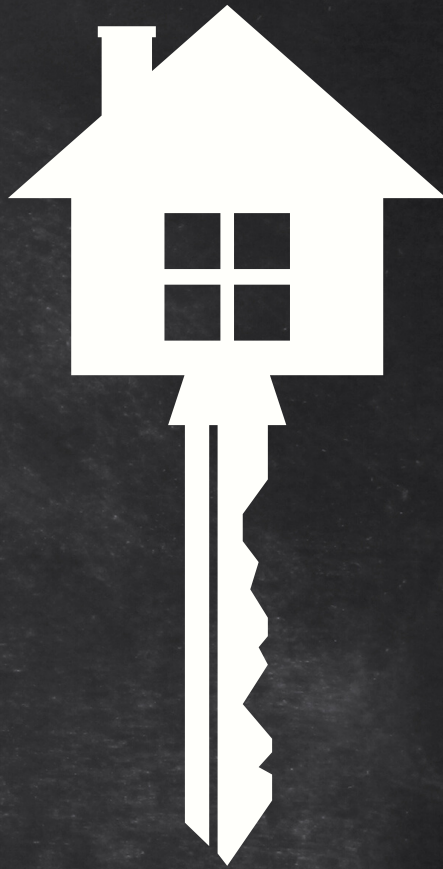


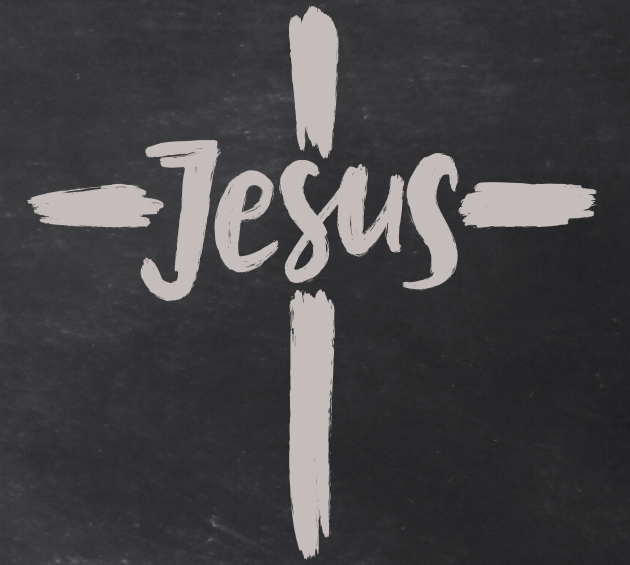

Introduction



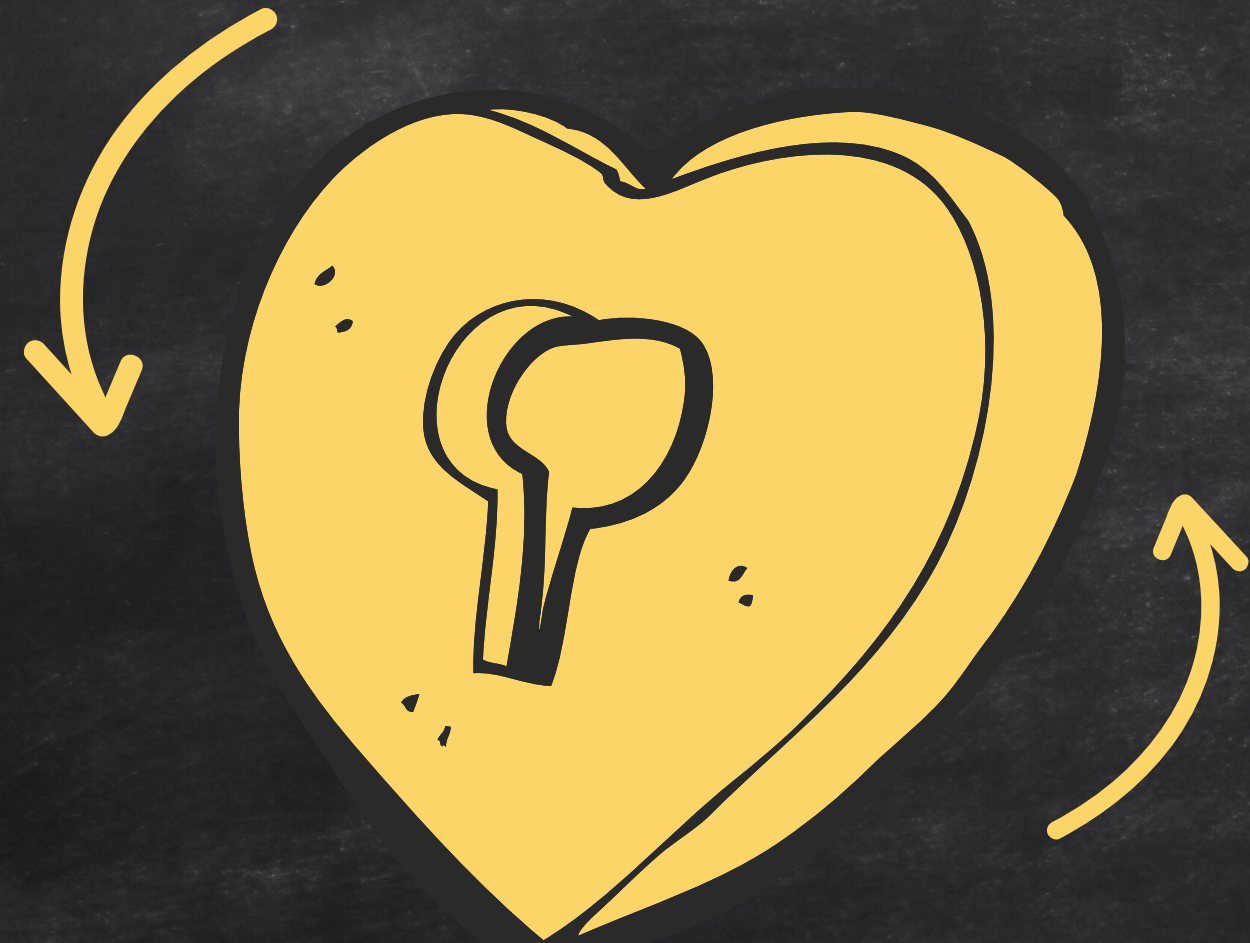
Through His Son, Jesus Christ, an all-powerful and generous God is eager to provide for your every need with His limitless resources.



Goodness



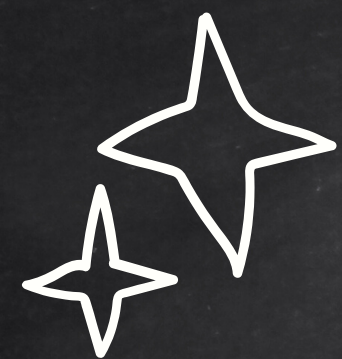
God is Good

2 CORINTHIANS 9:6

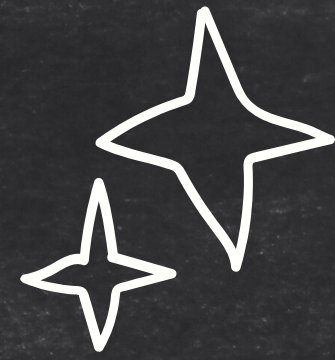

Tithing

Whilst it is recommended to sow at least 10% of your income, letting the Holy Spirit lead you in determining the exact percentage that should be allocated to the place where you receive spiritual nourishment is essential. Always remember that God is the source of your wealth, and giving back 10% of your earnings to Him is an act of love and gratitude. Keeping this perspective in mind will make giving a joyful experience.



Do NOT give under pressure

2 CORINTHIANS 9:7

Recognising the difference between being genuinely prompted by the Spirit to give and feeling pressured or manipulated is essential. Giving under compulsion is never a good idea, as there is no real blessing in doing so. Giving should be a voluntary act that stems from the heart. Remember, the money ultimately belongs to God. You don't need to feel pressured or manipulated to give it back to Him; His Spirit will guide you and show you when and where to give.

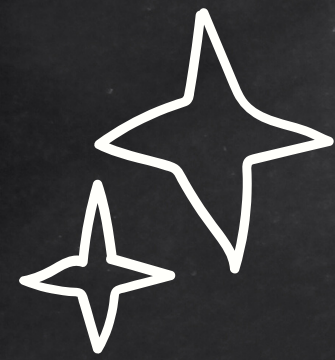


Overcome Financial Anxiety with Kingdom Investments

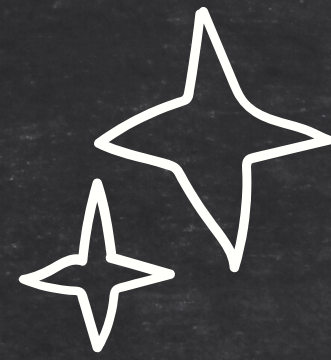
